ABOUT KINGS AND QUEENS

George II, King of England for thirteen years, didn't know how to speak or write English. He was a German and came to be king of England when he was already old. For this reason he thought it was not necessary to learn the language.

The Sacred Roman Emperor Charles V said, "I speak Spanish with God, Italian with women, French with men and German with my horse."

This story comes from Babilon of biblical times. Babilonians chose a "king-for-a-day" once a year. This king was sacrificed at the end of the day. Once they chose Enlil-Bani, a gardener of the palace, to be the "king-for-a-day". On the same day, the real king died and Enlil-Bani went on being a good king for the next twenty years.

Before queen Hatshepsut, Egypt had only men pharaohs. Because of conventions, in all official pictures queen Hatshepsut wore men's clothes.

After her husband died, when she was still young, Queen Victoria of England asked her maid to put her husband's night clothes on his bed every night. This went on until the end of her life.
